

Where to go for urgent care

A&E treats life-threatening or serious injuries and illnesses following an accident or medical emergency.

Examples of situations where going to A&E would be appropriate are:

- suspected broken bones
- severe blood loss
- drug overdose
- loss of consciousness
- suspected heart attack or stroke

If you are unable to get the patient to A&E, or suspect that medical attention is required as a matter of extreme urgency (e.g. someone has lost consciousness and remains unconscious)

dial 999 for an ambulance.
